

Barbara Priestman Provider Access Policy



Introduction

This policy statement sets out the arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at Barbara Priestman Academy for the purposes of providing information about their education or training offer.

This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Student entitlement

All students are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of the careers programme, which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer regarding technical education and apprenticeships – through options evenings, assemblies, careers workshops and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for technical courses and apprenticeships.
